### Opinion Survey

### New Learning Spaces for Students

We have been working away at redeveloping student learning spaces in the school. One of these spaces, the area in the foyer in front of the classrooms, has become known as the "HAMSTER Hutch". In this case, **HAMSTER** stands for **H**umanities, **A**rts, **M**athematics, **S**cience, **T**echnologies and **D**esign, **E**ngineering and **R**esearch. In this space, students will have access to a range of provocations to provide inspiration for self-directed exploration and learning aligned to the Victorian Curriculum, school priorities and their own goals and interests.

We are looking forward to using this space from the beginning of Term 4 and would greatly appreciate donations of any of the following that you may have lying around:

- Interesting fibres and materials for exploration - eg; shorn wool, strips of leather, cotton fibres, hessian and other fabrics, string, nails or screws, wood offcuts, etc.
